PENTECOST SUNDAY

For Fifty Days we have lived and breathed the miracle of Easter/Pentecost. Hopefully we have reflected and understood - better than ever before - that this is not just a spectacular episode of Salvation History that happened a long time ago, but that it still touches us with its reverberations. For us as a people of faith, Easter/Pentecost is NOW. It is the continuing invitation from our God for an ongoing, ever new encounter with Him and with others.

The impact of the entrance of Jesus into human history is an unending source of power and challenge in every age. The miracle of God becoming man is unending. It continues to touch out minds and hearts and lives, to challenge us, to invite us to change.

Change is always threatening. The human spirit is really torn in two directions. We have a deep hunger for stability and security, but we are also aware of a profound thirst for knowledge, for growth and improvement, for expanding horizons and fulfilling innate potentials. We have to break out of ourselves if we really want to live.

And so God offers to us a model in the Easter/Pentecost mystery. He enters the human condition to encounter us personally, and to enable us to encounter others. The Incarnation led to Easter and Pentecost. The Son of God in our flesh leads us through life, through death, to resurrection. Jesus clearly promises that this mystery will continue to evolve down the centuries through the constant outpouring of the Spirit.

Pentecost is not just a feast. It is not just the "birthday of the Church." It is a "state of mind." It is the "soul" of Christianity. It is the unending miracle of God's love poured out in the hearts of believers. It is the abiding power-source of Gospel living. And it is not just a personal gift to the faith-filled. It is a gift to all of creation. It is the fulfillment of God's promise to "Change the face of the Earth."

Jesus breathed new life into his disciples. First, by his greeting, "Peace be with you" - which were reconciling words to them after they failed him so miserably during the Passion and Crucifixion and then he bids them peace again and with that, he began a new creation by his breath - the Spirit. They are commissioned to take this reconciling peace and to proclaim it to the world. But that's not the end of the story. By his breath Jesus has given us a new Spirit. We are also re-created with the breath of life. Breathing new life into us Jesus sends us out to take his breath into the world. That is who we are.

We cannot and must not be passive. We must not resist change, but welcome it, foster it. Above all, we must not fear the movements of the Spirit, but embrace them with trust, with generosity and with courage.

The message of Jesus is intended for all people, in all times and places. The language of Jesus is the language of the spirit, one that transcends nationalities and all other divisive elements. We must learn the language of the Spirit. Change and diversity are integral elements of the vocabulary of the Spirit.

If we understand and accept the Easter/Pentecost mystery, we should realize how the church of Christ is enriched by the great variety of cultures and thought that come to celebrate unity of heart and mind in the spirit of Pentecost. Diversity is not to be an obstacle or a threat to us, but rather a beginning point towards unity. This oneness in faith and love is the strongest evidence that Jesus and His spirit are in fact working among us to bring all people together in the peace and justice of God's kingdom.

John XXIII said that "we are not here to guard a museum, but to cultivate a flourishing garden of life." The Holy Spirit is the gardener who has planted the seeds. It is up to us to bring the harvest of that garden to fruition.

ARCHDIOCESE MISSIONARY COOPERATION PLAN

ORDER OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY AND OF THE CAPTIVES (OSSTMISSIONS.ORG) SECOND COLLECTION JUN 21ST & 22ND

On June 21st and 22nd, Fr. Edward Owens, OSsT, (Order of the Most Holy Trinity and of the Captives) will be in our parish for a mission appeal. Fr. Edward is a Trinitarian priest who taught scripture at seminaries and universities for several decades, most recently in San Antonio. He had written for Paulist, Liturgical, and other presses. He currently enjoys retirement at his community in Trenton Diocese and pastoral ministry. At each Mass Father will ask for our prayers and financial assistance as his Order works to expand its ministry of Catholic education in Kamrup (Assam) India. Most of the Christians in this secluded part of the country belong to tribal communities and are often persecuted for their faith by non-Christian tribes. In this part of the county children do not have access to a proper education due to extreme poverty and persecution. The Trinitarians in India hope to expand their ministry of Catholic education through their newly opened DeMatha English Medium School. This expansion will allow the school to add additional grade levels, dormitories for boarding students, a Monastery for the religious. a playground for the younger children, and an auditorium. The Trinitarians are hopeful that your generosity during this Mission Appeal will help them to more effectively live their school's motto, "Educate to Liberate." Please consider supporting the work of the Trinitarians in India as they continue to spread God's mercy and redemption in this remote part of the world. INDIVIDUAL PRESENTING HIMSELF AS A PRIEST

The Archdiocese of Newark has been notified that an individual named (Horacio) Daniel Medina has been falsely presenting himself as a Catholic priest in the northern New Jersey area where he is celebrating Mass in people's homes and then ministering confessions and blessing homes and religious articles. Mr. Medina was permanently removed from the clerical state by the Holy Father in 2013. As a result of the laicization, he is forbidden from wearing clerical dress and from functioning in any capacity as a priest. He is not authorized to celebrate the sacraments, including the Eucharist, or engage in any priestly ministry.

Prior to his laicization, Mr. Medina was arrested and charged with child abuse. His name appears on the Archdiocese of Newark's list of credibly accused priests. We urge both clergy and the faithful to refrain from participating in any further attempt by Mr. Medina to offer the Mass or administer other sacraments. We strongly encourage that any such activity be reported immediately to the Archdiocese of Newark at 973-497-4254.
