SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

Pope Francis once commented on how today's Catholics can proclaim Christ and live the Gospel message in the modern world. The key, he said, is lived witness. "The love of Christ, poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, enables us to live like this, to be like this: as persons always ready to forgive, always ready to trust, because we are full of faith in God, always ready to inspire hope, because we ourselves are full of hope."

This week we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Trinity and there is a sense of closure about this feast. As we come to worship each week, we journey through salvation history from Ash Wednesday to Pentecost, commemorating the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, his ascension to the Father, and the sending of the Holy Spirit.

The Feast of the Holy Trinity summarizes all of these events in terms of how they help us understand the mysterious nature of our God, and his presence in our world and in our lives.

Yes, our God is a mystery, invisible, and transcendent. But our God is personal, and intimately bound up in who we are, what we do and how we relate to one another. The community of persons in the Triune God is the result of a divine love that is so intense and so profound that it cannot be contained or defined in a single dimension. It is a love that not only creates, but a love that redeems and sanctifies. It is a love that brings light and warmth to the dark side of our journey. It is a love that is constantly healing our brokenness, lifting us above our selfishness and pettiness, and reaching out to save us when we edge toward the abyss of despair. It is this Love that helps us to maintain a sense of purpose and peace and unity in our lives. It is this love that enables us to go out and preach to all nations.

We are in constant need of union. Think about it. How do you feel when you are rejected, or when you were cut off from family and friends, or perhaps when you were betrayed by a friend, or felt isolated. We do not even like going to the movies or out to dinner alone. Solitary confinement is seen as a harsh and horrible form of punishment.

Rejection is such a terrible hurt, because we need to be connected. So, why this driving need for union? The answer lies simply and profoundly in today's Feast of the Holy Trinity: We are made in the image and likeness of God. And God is communion, relationship. And therefore, so are we. Relationship is what God is all about: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Trinity says God is relationship, and so we search and seek. The Trinity says God is love, and so we love. God is love and unity, so we strive for the same. It is no wonder that we, who are created in His image and likeness, are also essentially about relationships.

The Holy Trinity should not be reduced to a "doctrine" that we commemorate each year. It is the active presence of a God who continues to pour out His love on this community as we journey in faith.

On June 21st and 22nd, Fr. Edward Owens, OSsT, (Order of the Most Holy Trinity and of the Captives) will be in our parish for a mission appeal. Fr. Edward is a Trinitarian priest who taught scripture at seminaries and universities for several decades, most recently in San Antonio. He had written for Paulist, Liturgical, and other presses. He currently enjoys retirement at his community in Trenton Diocese and pastoral ministry. At each Mass Father will ask for our prayers and financial assistance as his Order works to expand its ministry of Catholic education in Kamrup (Assam) India. Most of the Christians in this secluded part of the country belong to tribal communities and are often persecuted for their faith by non-Christian tribes. In this part of the county children do not have access to a proper education due to extreme poverty and persecution. The Trinitarians in India hope to expand their ministry of Catholic education through their newly opened DeMatha English Medium School. This expansion will allow the school to add additional grade levels, dormitories for boarding students, a Monastery for the religious, a playground for the younger children, and an auditorium. The Trinitarians are hopeful that your generosity during this Mission Appeal will help them to more effectively live their school's motto, "Educate to Liberate." Please consider supporting the work of the Trinitarians in India as they continue to spread God's mercy and redemption in this remote part of the world. 
1. You can give to the parish through the Zelle online payment system offered through most major banks. When you create the Zelle payee for the parish, please use the parish email address:

SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS FRIDAY, JUNE 27TH 7:30 PM

We invite all members of our parish family to attend the bilingual liturgy as well as the hospitality which will follow in the school cafeteria. **Please note that this will be the only Mass celebrated on June 27th.** Msgr. Bill Reilly will be our guest celebrant.

Celebrated on the third Friday after Pentecost, the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus recognizes Jesus' great love for us as symbolized by His heart.

The devotion began in the 1670s, when Jesus appeared multiple times to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, a Visitation nun in France. Through these visions, He told her how He wished to be honored with the symbol of His heart, asking for the faithful to make amends for any wrongdoing they had done, frequently take Communion, and observe the Holy Hour. In 1856, the devotion was added to the church calendar by Pope Pius IX.
